	Core idea and primary focus: Following the Russian invasion of Ukraine, significant shifts have occurred in the energy markets across Europe, particularly in the Danube region. Concurrently, all EU member states are required to submit their national energy and climate plans. By November, preliminary steps towards implementation may already be under discussion (e.g., in SK, RO). The panel discussion will address inquiries concerning energy infrastructure, connectivity, and energy flows, while also focusing on planning and financing the energy sector's transformation. This includes initiatives within the EU such as the RRPs, as well as efforts for EU candidates facilitated through ERPs, the Western Balkan Reform & Growth Facility, and IPAs.
